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What You Need to Know

Housing and Meals: \$1,565.00

Students will stay with local Greenville host families and be provided with up to three meals per day. For the occasional off-campus activities and excursions, students are responsible for purchasing their own meals.

Eligibility and Levels of English

Applicants must be at least 18 years old to be eligible for the program. Students are assigned to English language classes according to level of proficiency.

The Institution

East Carolina University is an academic leader in the Southeast U.S., with several nationally recognized programs. ECU offers more than 100 undergraduate and 75 graduate programs, including schools of business, medicine, nursing and engineering.

The ECU Language Academy is an accredited English as a Second Language (ESL) academy associated with East Carolina University. In addition to the Summer English program, the academy offers an intensive program of academic English for degree-seeking students.

Visa

Students will need to apply for an F-1 student visa to attend ECU's Summer English Program. ECU's Office of Global Affairs will assist students in obtaining their student visa.

Cultural Immersion

During an additional 4-10 hours per week, students are engaged in a variety of academic, cultural and social activities in the ECU-Greenville area.

Courses of Instruction

Students spend a minimum of 18 hours per week in the classroom, with intensive instruction in the areas of grammar, writing, and oral communication. The 90 contact hours is the equivalent of 6 U.S. credit hours of instruction.

Excursions

Students will visit:

- an American baseball game
- New Bern, North Carolina's colonial capital
- Atlantic Beach and historic Beaufort
- Sylvan Park Bird Sanctuary
- the North Carolina Estuarium
- local ECU and Greenville attractions
- optional visit to Washington, D.C.*
